Program Overview

English Language Arts at Westwood High School is a literacy-based program. Students will be engaged with literary selections in a wide variety of activities which target the three student competencies set out by the Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport for English Language Arts (ELA).

The student competencies in ELA are as follows:

- Use language to communicate and learn
- Read and listen to written, spoken and media texts
- Write a variety of genres for personal and social purposes.

There are several specific end-of-cycle outcomes for each competency that students will be working to achieve in their ELA program. There are also several specific evaluation criteria for each competency. Put in straightforward terms, students in Secondary II English at Westwood will be engaged in a stimulating variety of activities, which will further develop their **Reading, Writing, Speaking, and Listening** skills. Activities will include reading stories, novels, articles, poems, writing paragraphs, journal responses, short essays., participating in discussions, oral presentations, debates, creating photo essays, picture books, media presentations and listening to the teacher, fellow students, as well as audio and video recordings.

Evaluation

Evaluation will be reported as a percentage mark for all three English Language Arts competencies on each term report card. The mark will be made up of results in several categories: written assignments, oral presentations, journal and response writing, tests, daily classwork and homework. There will be a mid-year exam for all students. There will be a summative evaluation in May-June. This Evaluation Situation (ES) or Learning and Evaluation Situation (LES) comes from the Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport and is designed to evaluate all of the English Language Arts competencies.

Exams: Exams are done during regular class time only. Students must be in attendance for the entire period of the exams. **(January 16 - 31, 2017 and May 8 - 29, 2017)**

A general guideline to what the term percentages represent:

90-100% – Excellent achievement; the student is far above expectations for the grade level

80-90% –Superior achievement; the student is exceeding grade level expectations

70-80% – Expected achievement; the student is performing at the grade level

60-70% – Struggling achievement; the student is meeting a minimum acceptable standard

Less than 60% – Failing achievement; the student is not meeting a minimum standard
